1913 Expanding 3-Way Spring Hook


This is a very ingenious spring-loaded fishing hook which is designed so that when taken by a fish, the three lower hooks expand in unison inside of the fish's mouth.

This example retains 110% of its original black japanning, and appears to have never even been close to the water.

The country of origin of this hook is unknown. An advertisement which features drawings of this spring hook appeared in the 1913 Swedish edition of Lundgren's magazine (pictured below), but since that edition also featured advertisements for several purely American made spring hooks, such as the Sockdolger, Payton Guillotine and Spring, Snap and Catch 'Em, and no other information on this hook has of yet been found, no country of origin can be assumed or assigned.

This is obviously a factory piece, and it is possible that it could have been produced in other sizes. This is a very rare spring-hook and is the only example that this collector is aware of....(from the collection of William Blauser).
